On 20 and 21 October, Mykolas Romeris University (MRU) in Vilnius, Lithuania, hosted the International Conference “STEM and the Humanities: Innovation and Social Change”, the final event of the European project STEM Skills for the Humanities (Erasmus+ KA220-HED).

The initiative represented a moment of synthesis and reflection on the results achieved by the consortium and on future prospects for international collaboration in the field of interdisciplinary education.

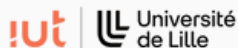
The meeting concluded with a networking moment and a cultural tour of the city of Vilnius.

On 21 October, the MRU hosted the interdisciplinary academic conference STEM4HUMANITIES-ISC2025, which brought together researchers, teachers and professionals from across Europe. The objective of the event was to explore how the convergence between STEM disciplines and humanities can stimulate innovation, strengthen collaboration between universities and encourage the social impact of university education, through implementations of online internships, with small and medium-sized businesses in the area.

The event confirmed the relevance of STEM4Humanities as a pioneering initiative for the integration of technology, education and humanistic culture in Europe.

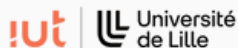
